

INDIANA PRESSLER MEMORIAL CHAPTER OF HFMA

Medal of Honor Award

DEFINITION:

This policy defines the guidelines and criteria used to select and recommend Members for the Medal of Honor Award, an award given through National HFMA.

POLICY:

It is the policy of the Board of Directors (the "Board") to annually request from National HFMA the list of candidates who qualify for the Medal of Honor Award. This list will be reviewed and candidates who meet the following criteria will be recommended for this award:

- Must currently be a member in good standing;
- Must have a minimum of three (3) years of service since earning the Muncie Gold Award;
- Must have accumulated a minimum of seventy-five (75) points during the three (3) years of service since earning the Muncie Gold Award or one hundred (100) points during the four (4) years of service since earning the Muncie Gold Award;
- Must have served at least two years as a Chapter Officer; and,
- Must have provided significant service at the Chapter and/or National level in at least two of the three or four years of service following receipt of the Muncie Gold Award.

The Board may, at its discretion, recommend a Member for this award who may not meet either of the above points criteria, but who meets all of the other criteria and who has been an active Member in the Chapter over a longer period of time and who, in the Board's opinion, has significantly benefited the Chapter.

Further, it is the policy of the Board of Directors to ensure that this award is given to encourage volunteerism and leadership by Chapter Members to benefit the Chapter.
