Presentation Title: The Role of Data Compliance in Population Health

Topic Description: To succeed in value driven care, stakeholders are harnessing the power of data. This seminar will focus on compliance issues that arise when managing data as part of a population health initiative. In particular, the seminar will focus on regulatory and contractual considerations related to the use of health information technology in population health. This will include privacy and security requirements applicable to shared data and a review of current risks associated with the privacy and security of health information. Additionally, the seminar will address challenges with interoperability and data blocking faced by health care organizations seeking to leverage data across various providers and other entities. To conclude we will identify methods to understand and minimize risk to your organization when engaging in population health programs.
